### 2025-26 School Uniform

Just a reminder for all parents to familiarise themselves with the correct uniform before purchasing items of clothing and footwear in readiness for the new academic year. We believe that a uniform looks smart, wears well, is cheaper for parents/carers and contributes to a feeling of belonging. School uniform is compulsory. Any parents/carers experiencing difficulty in providing the uniform should contact the Headteacher, as help may be available.



Please ensure your child also has the correct PE kit, as detailed below. Football kits and different coloured t-shirts and tracksuits etc. are not permitted.

If your child is joining Y6 in September, they will have the opportunity of purchasing the Holy Cross Y6 leavers' hoodie during Term 1 and this can be worn all year through. If you are intending to buy one of these, it will mean that you will not need to buy as many school jumpers for your son/daughter.

Although many children like to have colour put into their hair during the summer, this must be removed <u>before</u> they return in September. A reminder that hair should not be highly stylised and this includes shaved hair lines or tramlines etc being cut into the hair.
