English

Macbeth – William Shakespeare

We will read Leon Garfield's version of Macbeth and focus on the main characters: Macbeth, Lady Macbeth, Banquo and the three witches. Here we will write in role as both Macbeth and Lady Macbeth, explore the madness of Lady Macbeth by writing a report on her illness and will also write a balanced argument based on the murder of King Duncan.

In Reading we will be looking at the lyrics of Yellow Taxi, nonfiction texts and Christmas themed poetry, analysing them using VIPERS styled questions.

<u>PE</u>

This term we will learn to play tag rugby. We will work on our passing and receiving the ball skills, attacking and defending as well as finding a space and scoring.

History

Our history topic on the Home Front in WW2will continue this term. We will learn why Britain had to go to war, the role of artefacts in our understanding of the past (WW2), the role women played as well as the jobs required on the Home Front. We also examine the role of propaganda and government censorship.

French

In French, children will learn six hobbies and engage in conversations with each other to say which hobbies they like and dislike. They will then apply these skills to write simple and complex sentences explaining which hobbies they like and dislike.

Music

In music, children will be developing their ensemble skills by working as a team to ensure that everyone is playing at the same time and that there is clear use of dynamics and expression.

Maths

In maths we will begin securing knowledge of multiples of 1000 including roman numerals. Next, we will explore place value up to 7-digit numbers as well as comparing and ordering numbers up to 8 digits. We will also be rounding numbers and solving problems. Afterwards, we will focus on equivalence through scaling factors and times tables revision.

By the end of the unit, all children will have planned and created their own blogs and have demonstrated an awareness of how the information presented in a blog has an impact upon the audience.
