English

Year 6 will read *Street Child* by Berlie Doherty, exploring the harsh realities of Victorian workhouses. Through this, they will understand the difficult lives of poor children in the 19th century. They will then use their knowledge to create a non-chronological report, developing research, writing, and historical enquiry skills.

Reading

Year 6 will refine their guided reading skills by practising clear, concise answers. They will also read for pleasure three times a week, enhancing fluency and fostering a love of literature. This balance of structured practice and independent reading helps develop comprehension, confidence, and a lifelong appreciation for books.

Geography

This term, Year 6 will continue to explore earthquakes and tsunamis, understanding what causes them and why they happen in certain areas. They will examine their impact on people, safety measures in place, and how Japan has improved its buildings for protection. Using their knowledge, students will design their own earthquake-proof buildings, applying real-world problem-solving skills!

Computing

This term, Year 6 will be exploring the history of the internet and considering what the future might hold. They will learn how computers access the Internet at home and school. They will know about the difference between a WAN and IAN

Music

Year 6 will discover the power that music has to bring people together. They will explore how the different styles of music in this unit developed from different social themes.

Maths

In maths we will continue to on arithmetic and reasoning skills whilst covering more of the curriculum including: missing angles, understanding algebra and finally, using and interpreting statistics.
